- For me, doubt works in an inwardcurving spiral, much like self-pity. I begin with a complaint against the church, or confusion about some doctrine, and end up in a 'Slough of Despond.' I see only the contradictions, the negatives, the darkness...



...At such times I need a Doubt Companion, a compassionate listener who does not judge but will walk beside me in strength. 8. Ideally, the church should supply these companions, yet local churches often react to doubters with suspicion and judgment...



... More commonly, a trusted small group, or even a single friend can provide what we desperately need: someone unthreatened by doubt who rewards rather than punishes honesty, and who can gently bring light into darkness.
